Our Mission

Our mission is to empower children and their communities in developing developing countries through the provision of new school facilities, educational opportunities and safe, sustainable and healthy learning environments.

How We Undertake School Projects

- SCWCanada creates partnerships with communities that are in dire need of educational facilities.
- We work with communities to determine a suitable site.
- We develop a **schematic design** and determine a **preliminary budget once** the community agrees to help with construction and funding.
- All parties sign a **covenant/partnership agreement** which identifies the responsibility of each group.
- The local government or community agrees to provide the teachers
- Our construction team and a local architect develops the design and prepares construction drawings for tender to contractors.
- Our architectural representative on the site ensures the quality of the work is satisfactory, prepares payment certificates and signs off on the project at completion.
- The community helps with construction by preparing the site, moving earth
 as required and sometimes helping with the painting, as examples of their
 input.

Regarding the financing of the project, **SCWCanada** pays at least 50 to 65% of all costs, community sweat equity usually amounts to approximately 15% and the local municipality contributes about 20%. These percentages vary on every project. At the conclusion of construction, there is usually a large celebration organized by the community.

Funds Raised to Date

General donations by individuals, corporations and institutions are approximately \$1,850,000 from 2005 until the end of 2022. This includes donations from a starting point of \$25 up to the largest donation of \$74,546 (given by one individual). The annual golf tournament which commenced in 2009, has raised over \$1,275,000 up to 2022. Historically over 91% of all funds raised goes to our capital projects.



Patrons

Since 2013, SCW.CA has created a procedure to thank our most generous donors. The threshold for giving in terms of funds is \$15,000, but we also recognize individuals who have given their time volunteering over a number of years. Our first event in the fall of 2013, recognized three consultants, two contractors, two corporations, one charity, one school and two individuals. In 2015 we recognized 15 patrons made up of individuals and corporations who have supported our work.



Completed Projects Examples

Escuela Delvin Leonardo Salgado "The Jungle School" Brisas, Honduras

Located in a remote village, Brisas el Congo, "the Jungle School "includes a new classroom with adjacent washrooms and a fenced playground. SCW Canada has also provided furniture and school supplies. Visit our website scwcanada.ca to view a video of the dedication of this project.





Escuela Jose Trinidad Reyes y Jardin de Ninos Aquistimula Queepi "Matadero School", Honduras



This site is located in a remote highland village with very limited access, no electricity and limited water supply. The project involved demolition of two existing derelict classrooms and the construction of one new classroom, one new kindergarten classroom and new washrooms.

Escuela Edgardo Oyuela Jardin de Ninos Jesus Urbina, Honduras

This was a joint project by SCW Canada with The Awty International School in Houston and the local municipality and community. The project includes one classroom and a kindergarten classroom with washrooms.



San Iviateo School Phase 2, San Iviateo, Ecuador

The second phase of this school consists of 3 classrooms, a covered Kitchen/dining space, a playground and a retaining wall that claims an area for future classroom expansion.

The completed school now serves 700 students.



Kinder Emerita Castellanos, "The Storefront School", Honduras

With a new site this school replaces the temporary school that was accommodated in a storefront. The project includes a new classroom, washrooms and a playground.



Escuela Rural Mixta Almo Rodes de Fallos Sol Resplandecientos, "Las Margaritas", Honduras

This project included renovations to 2 existing classrooms and construction of 2 new kindergarten classrooms and washrooms.
